## RECRUITMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS

Six of the Trust's directors are elected by members at the annual general meeting. Up to three directors may be co-opted by the board of directors. One is appointed by Kilmaronock Community Council.

## **GOVERNING DOCUMENT**

Kilmaronock Community Trust is a charitable company, limited by guarantee, without a share capital.

#### **CHARITABLE PURPOSES**

Our purposes, as recorded in our Articles of Association, are:-

- To manage community land and associated assets for the benefit of the Community and the public in general.
- To provide, or assist in providing, recreational facilities, and/or organising recreational activities, which will be available to members of the Community and public at large with the object of improving the conditions of life of the Community.
- To advance community development, including urban or rural regeneration within the Community.
- To advance the education of the Community about its environment, culture, heritage and/or history.
- To advance environmental protection or improvement including preservation, sustainable development and conservation of the natural environment, the maintenance, improvement or provision of environmental amenities for the Community and/or the preservation of buildings or sites of architectural, historic or other importance to the Community.

#### RECRUITMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS

Janet Beveridge was elected and Mary Sweetland re-elected as directors. (KCC have not nominated a director but Andy Sinnott attends as a representative.)

## **ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS**

Kilmaronock Community Trust (KCT) was set up to take forward developments in the community council area of Kilmaronock. It has delivered a variety of small projects, including enhanced facilities in the play park, a home energy audit and the toposcope at the rear of the Kilmaronock Millennium Hall.

## **Community Action Plan**

The Kilmaronock Action Plan 2016-2020 forms the basis of KCT activities for the coming years. It is a partnership agenda and feeds into a variety of other agendas including LL&TNPA, KCC, RSPB, WDC. The Action Plan is available to view on the Gartocharn Website and printed copies are available on request.

#### Membership

KCT had 25 full members in the current financial year.

## **Paths Group**

No further activities have been undertaken by the Paths Group but the intention is still to develop a path that can access the War Memorial and engage with the community, landowners and responsible bodies in matters of access and paths. KCT are also in contact with RSPB Loch Lomond regarding a joint venture to further develop the local path network.

#### **Broadband**

Broadband speeds remain poor across much of the community area. The Gartocharn Exchange is due to be upgraded to fibre by the end of 2018. In August 2018 we offered all properties in the KCT area the opportunity to try and bring Fibre to the Premises (FTTP) to the community using the Community Fibre Programme and the Gigabit Voucher Scheme. Approximately 158 positive responses were received and KCT expect to receive a plan and costings from Openreach in early November 2018 to establish if this can go ahead.

#### Millennium Hall Field.

In February 2018 KCT made a formal offer to purchase the field. This offer was rejected. KCT will continue to try and reach agreement with the owner on an acceptable purchase price should the opportunity arise.

#### **Grant Awards**

- KCT were grateful to receive a grant of £250 from LL&TNPA for general administration costs.
- The grant of £10,000 towards improvements to Gartocham Football Pitch, applied for in the last financial year, was received in March 2018. The improvement works are currently taking place and are expected to be completed in Spring 2019 at which time the money will be transferred to the contractors.
- £960 was received from the Scottish Land Fund to cover legal expenses involved in making an offer for the field.

## Gift Aid

KCT received £33.75 in this financial year.

#### **RESERVES**

The Trust had a surplus of £10,032.27 in the year and this has been transferred to our reserves. (This surplus includes the grant from WDC of £10,000.) The reserves at the year-end are £16,194.13.

The Trust will continue to seek funding from The Loch Lomond and the Trossachs Community Grants Scheme to cover running costs. Funding for projects will be sought from various sources when the opportunities arise.

#### PREPARATION OF ACCOUNTS

The accounts have been prepared on an accruals basis in line with the requirements of the Charities Act 1993.

## **AUDITORS**

The members have not required the company to obtain an audit in accordance with section 476 of the Companies Act 2006.

For the year ending 31 August 2018 the Company was entitled to exemption from audit under section 477 of the Companies Act 2006 relating to small companies.

## 1 Basis of preparation

Where incoming resources have related expenditure (as with fundraising or contract income) the Incoming resources with related expenditure incoming resources and related expenditure are reported gross in the SoFA. Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the charity has unconditional Grants and donations entitlement to the resources. Gifts in kind Gifts in kind are accounted for at a reasonable estimate of their value to the charity or the amount actually realised. Gifts in kind for sale or distribution are included in the accounts as gifts only when sold or distributed by the charity.

receivable.

received.
